

# MUSIC AT 11....

Our hymns this week were written in two different centuries. The 17th and the 20th.

Praise to the Lord the Almighty is based on Psalm 103: verses 1-6 and Psalm 150 verse 6 and is one of the most exuberant hymns of praise in the hymnal. It has a "galloping" rhythm and 14 syllables in each of the first two lines. The author Joachim Neander, who only lived 30 years, knew the tune from an earlier chorale and wrote his magnificent text as a praise to God marrying it with the tune "Lobe Den Herren." (Praise to the Lord)

Fred Pratt Green was one of the most prolific hymn writers of the 20th century, and is well known for his willingness and enthusiasm in writing hymns "on demand" and for special occasions. In 1967 he received a request from the Methodist hymnal committee of Great Britain for "a hymn which tackled the relationship of Sabbath and Sunday." His willingness also to make alterations is reflected in his comment about the "Lutheran Book of Worship" when it included this hymn. He wrote: "The changes asked for by your committee have improved it." This is a powerful hymn about the mission of the church. Lee Hastings Bristol Jr. (of the Bristol/Meyers family) wrote the tune for this hymn. He was President of Westminster Choir College from 1962-1969.

The text of our closing hymn was also written by Joachim Neader in 1680 and translated into English in 1986. The text was originally to be sung as a table Grace. English composer Herbert Howells has written a grand and beautiful tune to this text.

The Ronald McDonald House helps families with seriously ill children who are receiving medical treatment far from home by providing food, housing, and so much more. The Ronald McDonald House raises charitable revenue by recycling aluminum can tabs. Can tabs have significant value in the recycling industry, representing the purest form of aluminum. The aluminum that is donated to the Ronald McDonald House is taken to a local recycling station where it is weighed and cashed in by the pound. The money netted is used to assist the Ronald McDonald House with operational expenses such as household supplies.
